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

His search starts in the dusty archives of the old Moravian Church where he finds the inscription by German missionary, documenting the birth of his Khoikhoi great-great-grandmother.

It is a journey that will take the viewer from Botswana to Namibia, across the great Gariep into South Africa, to far flung culture rich communities like Wupperthal and Steinkopf.

It's a quest for the naked truth behind the indigenous Khoikhoi nation.







of this First Nation people



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
The Khoikhoi identity was merged into the


